



Awgof) or Endowment system. The waqf system thus became one of the hallmarks of the Islamic Way of Life over the centuries in all Muslim countries and in communities, ingreater or less endegree. The foundation for this proliferation was laid by Quranic injunctions and the Prophet (sow) and this resulted in several Sahabah (ro), and generations down the line to make Islamic endowments for both charitable causes and family purposes. Shouldn't we be reviving this tried and tested Prophetic and Divine system in South Africa and neighboring countries?

Currently, the whole field of Wagfor blamic Trusts is growing exponentially and requires professional advocacy, support, and management. Individuals, families, organisations, and institutions are being encouraged to establish endowments. It is imperative that knowledge and skills around Waqf/ Awqaf be made available to all those interested in its theory and application within Muslim communities especially in the Southern African region and Muslim Communities outside the Islam ic world.
